BIBLICAL TESTIMONY TO PARENTS

Jesus said that was the first and great commandment. And every Jew knew,just like I want every one of you to know, what comes next in this great text. "And these words which I command you shall be upon your heart, and you shall teach them diligently to your children." The first assignment a parent has after loving God is to store God's word in his heart and teach it to his children.

A GENERATION THAT DID NOT KNOW GOD

When Joshua finally disbanded the armies of Israel, the tribes moved into their new territories and took possession of the land. Joshua, the man of God, died at the age of 110 and was buried at the edge of his property in Timnath-heres, in the hill country of Ephraim, north of Mount Gaash. The people had remained true to the Lord throughout Joshua' s lifetime, and as long afterward as the old men of his generation were still living-those who had seen the mighty miracles the Lord had done for Israel.

But finally all that generation died; and the next generation did not worship Jehovah as their God and did not care about the mighty miracles he had done for Israel. They did many things that the Lord had expressly forbidden, including the worshiping of heathen gods. They abandoned Jehovah, the God loved and worshiped by their ancestors- the God who had brought them out of Egypt. Instead, they were worshiping and bowing low before the idols of the neighboring nations. So the anger of the Lord flamed out against all Israel. He left them to the mercy of their enemies, for they had departed from Jehovah and were worshiping Baal and the Ashtaroth idols.

¹⁵ So now when the nation of Israel went out to battle against its enemies, the Lord blocked their path. He had warned them about this, and in fact had vowed that he would do it. But when the people were in this terrible plight, **Judges 2:6-15TLB**

- c. To promote a forum and an environment that will encourage the attainment of wisdom more than anything else

Family Mission:

- a. To identify the values that shape our family to create a statement that defines who the family is, what the family represents and what the family members desire to accomplish
- b. To identify our family culture, what makes us different? What binds us together? How can we build a healthy culture?
- c. The number one force that will shape our family culture are our family values and beliefs
- d. A family united around a strong set of beliefs and values will be a strong family

One of the most comprehensive studies on preparing heirs was completed in 1994 by author Roy Williams. They studied 3,250 affluent families and confirmed 65-75% of estate transitions "fail" were due to the following causes:

- a. 60% were due to breakdowns in trust and communication within the family unit
- b. 25% were caused by inadequately prepared heirs
- c. 12% were due to lack of a family mission or purpose statement that clearly defines the use of the family wealth
- d. 3% or less were caused by incompetent advisors, lawyers and accountants

THE GOAL

"You can't leave character to a trust account. You can't write your values into the will. You can't bank traits like courage, honesty and compassion **in** a safe deposit box. What we need is a plan- a long term strategy to convey our convictions to the next generation" Tim Kimmel


